A Reflection from James Hogan – Can we follow Jesus without believing in His Resurrection?

No. Christianity is a religion based on a miracle. Take the miraculous out of Buddhism or Islam, and you have not altered their essential belief system. Take away the Resurrection miracle, and you have removed the essence of Christianity. That would be like taking nitroglycerin out of dynamite or cola out of Coke. A miracle-less, watered-down version of Christianity is not Christianity at all.

How Buddha died is not essential to his message. How Mohammed died is not critical to his message. How Jesus died, why Jesus died, and what happened after Jesus died are central to His entire manhood, message, and mission. All Catholic doctrines on trinity and time, sin and salvation, and heaven and hell... proceed from the Resurrection.

If you felt shockwaves from a blast that happened a mile away, you would assume the ground-zero explosion to have been that much more powerful than what you experienced. In a similar way, only an immensely powerful event could account for the subsequent, exponential growth of the Church. The Church's existence witnesses to a powerful ground-zero Resurrection explosion.

Something remarkable and real smelted cowardice into courage. The disciples went from deserters hiding in an upper room in fear for their lives, to defenders willing to risk torture and death. They attributed that transformation to the miracle of the Resurrection. We should listen to them.

Humanity labors in darkness, walking through the valley of the shadow of death. (Ps 23:4) Deep down, we are frightened by the inevitable fact that we, or someone we love, will die. But with the Resurrection – Jesus rising body and soul from the grave, possessing the properties of a glorious body not limited by space and time – we have been given definitive, historical proof that earthly life is but a prelude to eternal life.

And the truly good news is: He offers His Christ-life to us, if we have the courage to receive it. Jesus' rising body and soul foreshadows our resurrection of the body on the last day. Jesus' Resurrection is life's happy ending (our resurrection) revealed in the middle (His Resurrection). If we die with Christ, we shall rise with Christ.

Death scared the heaven out of us, so Jesus brought heaven to us. Jesus broke the stranglehold death had on humanity. Love conquered death. Because of the Resurrection, we should not live like there is no tomorrow; we should live like we know tomorrow. The Resurrection is not the promise that life ends well; it is the promise that life ends wonderfully.

To put it simply: Because Christ is risen, we shall rise.

Benedict XVI makes clear the meaning of the Resurrection, "Faith in the Resurrection of Jesus says that there is a future for every human being; the cry for unending life, which is a part of the person that is indeed answered. God exists; that is the real message of Easter."

He told Saint Faustina:

My daughter, tell the whole world about My Inconceivable mercy. I desire that the Feast of Mercy be a refuge and shelter for all souls, and especially for poor sinners. On that day, the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy. The soul that will go to Confession and receive Holy Communion shall obtain complete forgiveness of sins and punishment. On that day, all the divine floodgates through which grace flow are opened. Let no soul fear to draw near to Me, even though its sins be as scarlet. My mercy is so great that no mind, be it of man or of angel, will be able to fathom it throughout all eternity.

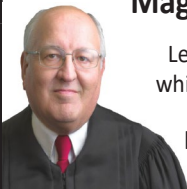
