A Reflection from Father Jay

75 YEARS OF CELEBRATING THE EUCHARIST

This past week in Indianapolis, Indiana, the Catholic Church in the United States held its tenth Eucharistic Congress. The last one was in 1941 (eight years before the founding of Saint Helen Parish). The Church in America is aiming to have another one in 2033, which will be the 2,000th anniversary of the passion, death, and resurrection of the Lord Jesus. This year's Eucharistic Congress was the culmination of the U.S. Bishops National Eucharistic Revival, which has sought to reignite a passion for the Lord truly present in the Blessed Sacrament.

Here at St. Helen, we have been celebrating the saving work of Jesus in the sacraments for 75 years. The highpoint of our 75th anniversary celebration will be a Mass celebrated by Bishop Malesic on August 18th at 11:15 a.m. Over the past 75 years, thousands of children have been baptized here, hundreds of adults have converted to the Catholic faith, thousands of young people have received the gift of the Holy Spirit in their Confirmation, more than 1,000 couples have entered into a lifetime commitment as they swore marriage vows, countless people have had their sins forgiven in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, and we have celebrated in hope that thousands of our parishioners have finished their earthly pilgrimage and have gone home to the Lord. The highpoint of any Catholic Parish, of course, is the celebration of Jesus' saving work in the Holy Eucharist. In light of that, we have celebrated tens of thousands of Masses where Jesus' saving work is presented to His people as they feast upon "the new manna," "the bread from heaven," "the very Body and Blood of the Savior of the world."

The "good news" of salvation is almost too good to believe! The all-powerful God loves us so much that He humbled Himself to become one of us; He was born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, He was crucified, died and was buried. On the third day, He rose from the dead, then ascended into heaven to prepare a place for His faithful people. And He chooses to share His saving grace with the people of the world through His Holy Church. None of us deserve these incredible blessings; they are pure gifts from the God who chooses to love us. The idea that the all-powerful God would become one of us and then share His own Body and Blood with us in the form of bread and wine just boggles the mind! How could the all-powerful God love us so much? How could the all-powerful God humble Himself so much?

One of the greatest mysteries that the Eucharistic Congress sought to address was, "how can we take for granted these incredible blessings?" Whenever we set foot into St. Helen Church, we enter the presence of God. When we come forward for Holy Communion, we are approaching God Himself, who chooses to share His very life with us. And yet, so often we refuse to be grateful for all that God has done for us. There are many Catholics today who cannot be bothered to come to God's house, on God's Day, with God's people, around God's altar to receive the very Body and Blood of the Lord.

As we celebrate our 75th anniversary of being a parish, we certainly want to be grateful for all the blessings that have come through our parish over the decades. We certainly want to foster in our hearts a deep sense of gratitude for all that Jesus has done for us. And at the same time, we want to please Jesus by loving one another. A huge part of the saving work of Jesus was to reunite a broken humanity. While Jesus calls us to love Him with all of our heart, soul, mind and strength, He also wants us to love our neighbor as we love ourselves. Let us love one another as we seek to glorify the God who has blessed us so much!


